As a consequence some of the QLD AIMS 2020 plan was not fully implemented, however below is a summary of 2020 activity and agenda items in the coming months and year.

The QLD AIMS Subcommittee held several meetings over the course of the last 12 months, recording minutes and all information passed on to the board for review and consideration.

The subcommittee has been involved with the review of an updated Recognised Standard 10. Ken Cross has done some really good work engaging the wider industry, seeking feedback and providing guidance.

We were fortunate to host an AIMS networking event at The Breakfast Creek Hotel in late August this year, with an outstanding turnout by both AIMS members and suppliers.
