Association of Consulting Surveyors NSW & Consulting Surveyors National (ACS)

- Invited by the Treasurer's office to take part in the Construction Working Group to help construction resume following the two-week lockdown.
- Daily webinars called "lunch n learn" for all staff within the member firms, which were attended by more than 100 people every day during the second week of the construction lockdown.
- ACS has moved office and will be holding a week of events from 15 November onwards.
- Online events have continued during the last quarter and ACS have partnered with the Country Surveyors Association on 22 October to hold the one day online seminar.
- The ACS Business Academy holds its final session on 18 November with the second cohort graduating.
- CSN held their National Awards online on 1 October and recognised a number of firms for the excellent work they are doing in their consultancies, with the winners and highly commended featured in the November edition of The Surveyor magazine.

 - 4. Diversity in Surveying


Surveyor General (SG)

- The Office of the Surveyor General (OSG) is progressing with updating the Surveying and Spatial Information Regulation.
- The Customer Hub is being well received with enhancements and new application types currently being developed, including for AUSPOS, Survey Mark Status, Locality Sketch Plans, Norfolk Island and State Border surveys.
- CORSnet-NSW data centres have been successfully migrated to a cloud environment.
- <u>GDA2020:</u> New GDA2020-aligned web services will be released by Spatial Services in early November. Refer to https://www.spatial.nsw.gov.au/ data/assets/pdf file/0008/229733/GDA2020 Webservices InfoSheet.pdf
- <u>Digital Survey Plans:</u> A discussion paper providing further details on the transition to digital survey plans was released in August 2021, and 50 submissions were received.
- <u>Geographical Names Board (GNB):</u> The GNB is proactively working with local councils to resolve duplicated suburb names which can cause confusion and delay of provision of services. There are currently 178 duplicated suburbs in NSW.

Surveying Education Reports

TAFE NSW

- TAFE NSW is progressing with the work involved with updating all surveying qualification units required for the new training package. This work is programmed to be completed ready for semester one, 2022.
- TAFE NSW continues to evolve in the creation of the ONETAFE NSW structure now approaching the fourth year of the six-year plan.
- Following committee review, Daren Robson is the latest recipient of the SMIC Scholarship. Daren has been awarded a \$1,500 Scholarship to complete his Certificate IV in Training & Assessment (TAE40116). Daren is pictured below. Please see page 4 for more details on the scholarship program.



University of New South Wales (UNSW)

- All teaching remains online, however field practicals are being delivered on campus with students.
- SURVSOC (Surveying student society) ran a Career event on 14 October and invited the Surveyor General Narelle Underwood to attend to discuss the pathway to registration. More than 40 students attended a professionally run event online.
- The Faculty/School were recently accredited after a visit from Engineers Australia.
- Undergraduate students in their penultimate year were interviewed for the 2022 Surveyor General's Scholarship.
- Craig Roberts continues to work with the NSW Department of Education and others in developing the iSTEM curriculum for T1, 2022.

University of Newcastle (UoN)

- The University Re-Structure program has now been implemented. Surveying remains in the Discipline of Civil, Surveying and Environmental Engineering, which is now part of the College of Engineering, Science and the Environment.
- Final Year Projects were presented by students on 22 October. Six of these students will now present expanded versions of their presentation to the Hunter Manning Group of the Institution of Surveyors.
- COVID prevented fieldwork classes from proceeding in semester 2. This meant two survey camps also had to be re-designed to run as online events.
- The University is moving to require all programs to include a minimum period of Work Integrated Learning (WIL).

University of Southern Queensland (USQ)

- The collaboration with Consulting Surveyors National (CSN) to deliver Cert IV & Diploma in Surveying is progressing.
- The Health, Engineering & Science Faculty have announced a restructure for the start of 2022. Headline changes include the rearrangement of the two present Engineering Schools into one.
- Due to COVID, the Honours Conference was again held online. There were 42 presenters and 170 participants involved.
- On Wednesday 24 November at 6pm AEST, UŠQ will be holding a 'Surveying Academic Ask Me Anything Session'. This will be aimed at people in the surveying industry without formal qualifications and those who might be looking to upgrade their qualifications.
